"My daughter is very quiet and shy. She wasn't always so quiet when she was younger - she used to express herself a lot. Now that she's a teenager, she is shyer and does not want to share a lot with her dad and me. But on this night, I could tell that the music started to bring her out of her shell. It was like she was the little toddler who was so happy and danced all the time. I have not seen her this way for too long. She tapped, clapped, and even though still reserved, I knew she really had a great time. It was a great moment for me as a mom to see my daughter with this much joy.
